

Creative Programme Manager (Internal)

Context

Project Art Works are the UK's leading artist-led organisation working with people who have learning disabilities and/or complex support needs. Our mission is to change lives through art by exploring the potential of each individual and sharing their creative abilities through a wide range of projects, partnerships and exhibitions.

Project Art Works have a wide-ranging **External** artistic programme aimed at raising awareness and developing skills in the public sector to promote diversity in programming and audiences. The bedrock of our practice is our **Internal** programme which is located at our studio base in Hastings. From here we currently deliver 5 weekly studio groups for up to 30 participants aged 18+ and a regular holiday and weekend programme for children and young people.

Holiday/Weekend programme

Art Breaks is an innovative project that focuses on children and young people with complex needs, alongside their parents, carers and non-learning disabled peers. The programme is delivered for up to 45 families across the year during the school holidays and for up to 24 families across 12 Saturdays during term-time. The programme is delivered at our studio base in Hastings and regional venues within Sussex.

Peer Support Programme

The Peer Support Network has grown alongside our In-House programme and is a resource for all of Project Art Works' stakeholders, offering support and advice on specific issues around disability and the services that support them. Through talks, workshops, and open discussions between families, providers, and experienced support workers the network provides opportunities for sharing knowledge about personalised provisions and identifying information gaps. Families are encouraged to share experiences, both positive and negative, and to work together to explore how to develop and run a successful provision for the people they care for.

Through the in house programme we have established a vital, creative and experimental wellbeing centre improving the life chances of people who have autism, learning disability and/or behaviours that challenge whilst supporting their families and wider care networks through advocacy, art and creative solutions to critical life transitions.
